	Professional	Amateur
Best in Show:	\$300	\$150
First Place		
Landscape/Scenic	\$75	\$ 50
"Scenic" images with or without buildings		
Animals/Birds/Insects	\$ 75	\$ 50
Both wild and domestic creatures; includes macros of any creature		
People	\$ 75	\$ 50
Portraits both formal and informal, groups, sports and performance events – anything in which the primary interest is the people		
Other Categories	\$ 75	\$ 50
Anything that would not fit into the above categories (e.g. still lifes, objects, flowers, gardens, architectural details, abstract/non-representational work, etc.)		
Photo Manipulation	\$ 75	\$ 50
Photo manipulation is the application of image editing techniques to photographs in order to create an illusion or deception after the original photographing took place		

Note: Categories with less than 7 accepted entries may be combined with another for award purposes only

Second and Third place ribbons will be awarded in all categories with an appropriate number of entries.

Rules for Exhibitors

- ENTRY FEE:** A maximum of 6 works per artist may be submitted. A fee of \$20 for 1-2 works and \$8.00 for each additional work up to six pieces.
- ELIGIBILITY:** Only completely original works that have not been entered in previous MCAC Art Shows will be eligible. Any work not of quality creditable to the show will be rejected. MCAC reserves the right to disqualify any piece whose content, in its judgment, does not meet generally accepted community standards of "good taste".
- DISPLAY:** All work must be wired and ready to hang. Framed work must be sound and suitably substantial for the artwork.
Saw tooth hangers are not acceptable.
- SET-UP:** All work will be hung and displayed by the Gallery Committee.
- REGISTRATION:** No pre-registration is required.
- PICK-UP:** No work will be removed before the close of the show. Pick-up will be on August 31st or September 1st, 2021 during normal Flat Iron Shop/Gallery hours. Note: If work is not picked up before September 2, 2021, it will become the property of the MCAC.
- RESPONSIBILITY:** MCAC is not responsible for loss or damage of artworks entered in the show. Exhibitors are solely responsible for their work and should insure work if they desire. Submission of entries implies acceptance of all conditions stated in these rules.
- SALES:** At least one entry must be for sale. The MCAC retains 30% commission on all sales and artists should include this commission in the retail price.

Guidelines for Determining if you are a Professional

Professional photographers normally make their living in part or totally from their photography; receive payment to do photography for portraits, weddings, or other events; and/or have a website set up to promote themselves as paid photographers. Everyone else is considered an amateur photographer.
